Madeira High School Receives National Recognition

Madeira High School (MHS) earned high National and metro-area rankings in '2022 Best High Schools', which was recently released by U.S. News. MHS is ranked fourth in Cincinnati, Ohio metro area high schools, and sixth within the state of Ohio. The school was also #206 in the National Rankings with an overall score of 98.85 out of 100.

According to U.S. News, "A great high school educates all students from different social and economic backgrounds, exposing them to challenging coursework on the path to graduation. The highest ranked U.S. public schools in U.S. News & World Report's 2022 Best High Schools rankings are those whose students demonstrated outstanding outcomes above expectations in math, reading and science state assessments, earned qualifying scores in an array of college-level exams, and graduated in high proportions."

U.S. News uses six ranking indicators to determine each school's rank: College Readiness (30%), College Curriculum Breadth (10%), State Assessment Proficiency (20%), State Assessment Performance (20%), Underserved Student Performance (10%), and Graduation Rate (10%). For the 2022 rankings, U.S. News adjusted its calculations to account for the impact the COVID-19 pandemic had on schools in the 2019-2020 school year.

"We are proud of our staff, students, and families who contribute to our school's success," MHS Principal Dave Kennedy stated. "Without the support our entire school community, recognitions like this would not be possible."

By earning a national ranking in the top 40%, Madeira High School achieved status as a U.S. News Best High School earning them a U.S. News-trademarked 2022 Best High Schools award "badge."
