### **Madeira School District Names Key Leaders**

The Madeira City Schools Board of Education approved two new hires into key roles for the 2019-2020 school year. The Board took action last night in hiring Mrs. Emily Hauser as the next school district Treasurer and Mrs. Nichole Huelsman as the next Madeira Middle School Principal. “We’re excited to have both of these administrators joining our team in Madeira,” said Kenji Matsudo, Superintendent.

Mrs. Emily Hauser will join Madeira after having served at St. Bernard-Elmwood Place for the last four years. Mrs. Hauser is highly regarded in the treasurer field as a very detailed, thoughtful, and student-centered treasurer. Prior to serving at Kings, Mrs. Huelsman was an Assistant Principal at Mason High School for 8 years as well as being a special education teacher prior to administration. “As a child, I spent many days visiting with my grandparents in Madeira. From those visits, I knew it was a special place. I am honored and excited to become a part of such a dedicated community and I look forward to working with MMS students, parents, and the staff,” said Huelsman.

The Board also accepted the resignations of long-time MES teacher and resident Jeanne Gulick and Assistant Superintendent Tim Weber at Monday’s meeting. Mrs. Gulick has been with the district for 29 years and will be retiring after helping many, many students over the years at MES. Assistant Superintendent Tim Weber resigned to accept a new role as Superintendent in Wyoming City Schools. “We will miss them both,” said Matsudo. “Jeanne has been an important part of our elementary school experience for many years.” Referencing Weber, Matsudo said, “Tim Weber is a charismatic leader and a trusted friend and we wish him well as he takes on his new role in Wyoming.
