• All three schools in the Madeira City Schools have been recognized by the United States Department of Education as Blue Ribbon Schools.

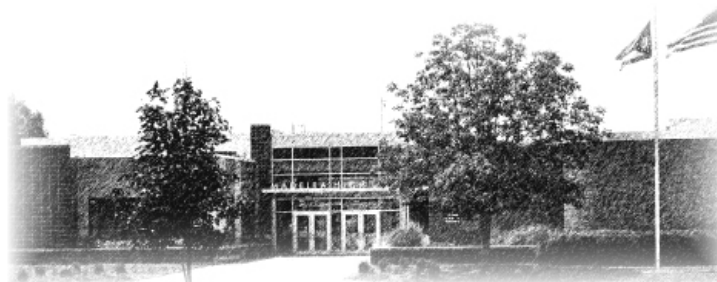

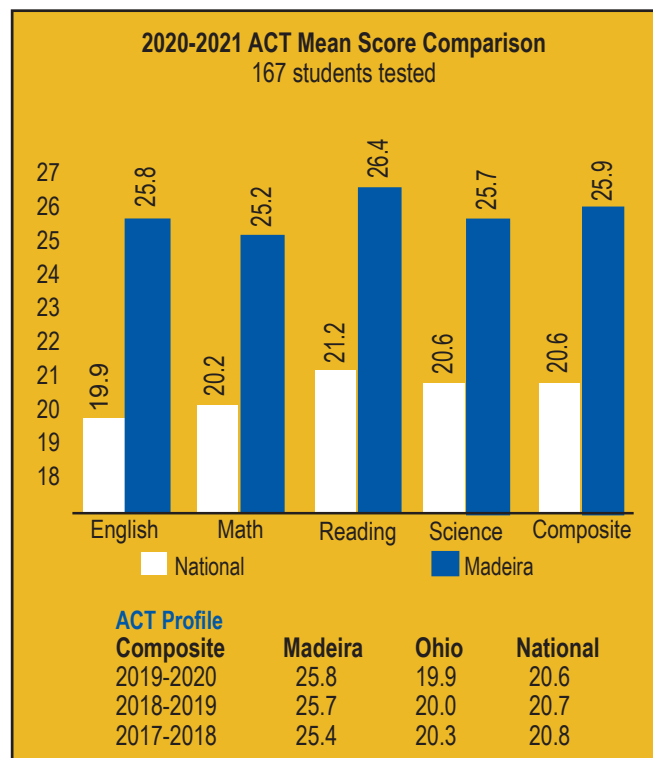

Madeira High School does not report class rank on the transcript.



COVID-19 Information - In March 2020, Madeira High School moved to a remote learning model in response to the Governor's directive for Ohio schools during the COVID-19 pandemic. Students were able to successfully complete the school year using this remote instructional mode. Grades in the 4th quarter only were assigned as Pass/Fail and averaged into the final grade calculation. No final exams were given in the spring of 2020. The final grades for the 2019-2020 school year are assigned as letter grades and averaged into the cumulative GPA as in the past. Because results from the first three quarters of the school year contribute to the final grade result, these grades can be considered representative of a student's academic accomplishment for each course. Most students in the 2020-2021 school year returned to in-person learning with a small percentage accessing coursework virtually.

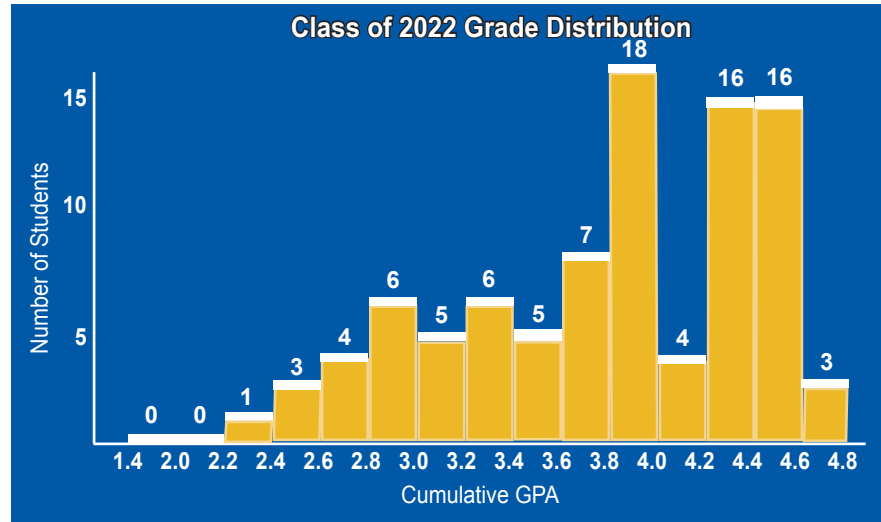
• An annual Day of Service, sponsored by the Madeira Schools Foundation, gives every high school student the opportunity to volunteer for over 30 local individuals and organizations.

Course Designations at Madeira High School

Students at Madeira High School are encouraged to select academically challenging courses appropriate to their ability and performance as well both their immediate and future goals in college and career. Course designations are based on the level of challenge provided by the course content.

Each subject area may contain courses covering the same content with different levels of rigor. Courses are described on the transcript by the descriptors detailed below.

• **Advanced Placement (AP)** These very rigorous courses follow the national curriculum provided by the CollegeBoard and result in the opportunity to sit for the Advanced Placement exam in the subject area. All Advanced Placement courses receive weighted grades (1.0).

• **Honors (HN)** This designation indicates courses that are highly demanding and prepare students for continuing work at selective four year colleges. All Honors courses receive weighted grades (.5).

• **College Preparatory (CP)** These courses are comprehensive offerings that effectively prepare students for postsecondary studies.

• **College Credit Plus (CCP)** The Ohio College Credit Plus program includes college coursework taught on or away from the Madeira High School campus. These courses earn transcribed college credit and also are included as high school credits. CCP courses are given weight equal to the most challenging offerings in each subject area. *These courses are represented by the college name, college course title and course number.*
